Impact of Zinc withdrawal from weaner diets – a survey

Impacted by the forthcoming withdrawal of Zinc Oxide (ZnO) from weaner diet? To help producers and the wider pig sector understand the effects of the withdrawal of ZnO from weaner diets on the incidence of postweaning diarrhoea, a consortium of researchers is calling on all producers involved with weaning and the rearing of weaned piglets to participate in an online survey.

Leading this survey component of the wider project, Dr Abel Ekiri said, "Collecting data about the impact of ZnO removal from feed on weaner health and welfare, as the industry is adjusting to this change will allow us to explore its implications in real-time, and to collect feedback direct from producers." Dr Ekiri added "In testing, the survey took about 30 minutes to complete, but it is only through collecting this level of detail that we can understand ways to mitigate the effects of the withdrawal of ZnO in the UK pig sector." The findings will be shared with producers and the wider stakeholder community, for example via future newsletters.

This research is organised by a consortium of research partners based

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University of Edinburgh, at the University Belfast. Queen's the University of Surrey, Napier University, Scotland's Rural College (SRUC), the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) and an industrial partner, the feed company AB Agri Ltd. The research is funded by a grant received from the BBSRC/AHDB Endemic Livestock Diseases Primina Partnership Initiative grant funding call.

Participation in this survey is entirely optional and all responses will be gathered anonymously via a secure online survey platform, overseen by the University of Surrey. 
